

What is a Compact for Student Success?

A Compact for Student Success is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all of our students reach or exceed grade-level standards.

Effective Compacts:

- Link to the school improvement plan goals
- Focus on improving students' academic performance
- Explain how teachers will support academic growth by providing high quality instruction
- Describe how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress and collaborate to support student learning
- Share opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in the classroom or school
- Outline the responsibilities of students, parents, and teachers in the educational process



Teachers, Parents, and Students Roles for Success

Roles of the School and Teacher

Little Oak Middle School teachers will communicate effectively with their students and families to support students' success in all subject areas.

Our teachers and classrooms will:

- Provide a safe and orderly environment in which children can learn
- Provide activities and lessons aligned with Louisiana State Standards and student performance expectations
- Provide high expectations for all students in an encouraging and supportive manner
- Provide an open line of communication with parents
- Provide remediation in subject areas in which students have performed below level
- Provide ongoing reports about each child's academic progress. e.g. Student Progress Center, quarterly report card, state assessment results
- Provide opportunities for parent and family engagement and partnerships
- Provide instruction for different levels and learning styles

Roles of the Parent

Little Oak Middle School parents will collaborate with the school and teachers in order to extend learning opportunities from the classroom into the home environment.

As parents, my responsibilities will be to:

- Make sure my child is on time and attends school on a regular basis
- Supervise homework and study time to make sure my child completes all assigned homework
- Provide a quiet place at home for my child to work, study, read, etc.
- Keep an open line of communication with my child's teacher(s) including parent/teacher conferences, written communication, and parent meetings
- Support the school and all teachers in maintaining a disciplined and safe instructional environment
- Encourage my child to do his/her best academically and socially
- Monitor my child's progress in activities in and outside of school
- Sign and return all report cards, and discuss them with my child

Roles of the Students

Little Oak Middle School students will join the school, teachers, and parents in taking an active role in ensuring their own success.

- I will arrive at school on time and ready to learn each day, with all materials needed and homework assignments completed.
- I will actively participate in classroom activities and remain on task.
- I will follow school and classroom rules and regulations.
- I will respect classmates, teachers, administrators, other school staff and myself.
- I will exhibit qualities of good citizenship.
- I will take all types of assessments seriously in order to demonstrate what I have learned.

District Goal

Implement a comprehensive academic program which assesses readiness and advancement in grades Pre-K through 12, providing the opportunity for student learning to culminate college and career readiness.

ELA Goal- By 2025, 80% of students will be performing at grade-level in English/Language Arts.

- 4-6 ELA will be measured by the percentage of students achieving scores of “Mastery” or “Advanced” on the LEAP 2025 Assessment.

Math Goal- By 2025, 80% of students will be performing at grade-level in Math.

- 4-6 Math will be measured by the percentage of students achieving scores of “Mastery” or “Advanced” on the LEAP 2025 Assessment.
